MOTION: Commissioner Heivilin moved, and Commissioner Sullivan seconded a motion to accept the disbursements for \$3,308,730.39 per the detail above. The motion passed; five ayes.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORT:

• Commissioner Fischer attended the visit of Governor Jay Inslee at the Shoreline Fire Department on January 26. In attendance were also the Shoreline City Mayor Chris Roberts, Shoreline Police Chief Kelly Park, Bristol Ellington City of Shoreline City Manager, and City of Shoreline Council Members. Governor Inslee gave a short speech on the opioid pandemic and the supplemental budget proposal to help address the issue. Governor Inslee included details on the proposed legislation to address mental health and other challenges emergency responders face when on calls.

STRATEGIC PLAN DISCUSSION:

 Chief Cowan attended a meeting with the Department's consultant Levrum Data Technologies to discuss the site analysis of Station 62 property. The preliminary data report should available in early April.

DISTRICT ACTIVITY REPORTS:

- Chief Cowan provided a written district activity report, which is attached and incorporated by reference.
 - Chief Cowan made one comment on his activity report, which noted that the Department's expense budget was 1.3% under budget. However, this did not include a late invoice the Department received, which was paid in 2024. If the invoice had been received and paid in 2023, the correct percentage would be .43%. The difference will affect the ability to stay on budget for 2024.
 - > Continued work on the reconciliation of the Northshore 2023 budget.
 - > Met with City of Bothell Fire Chief Mark Risen to discuss the Request for Proposal (RFP) for administrative services. The proposal is expected to be completed next week.
- Deputy Chief Foster provided a written district activity report, which is attached and incorporated by reference.
 - > Commissioner Fischer requested an update on the Department's RFP for new ambulance services. Chief Cowan noted that the American Medical Response (AMR) ambulance service was not pleased with the current Zone 1 contract. The contract has been extended temporally, while an RFP process for ambulance services is considered.

- **Deputy Chief Hochstein** provided a written district activity report, which is attached and incorporated by reference.
 - > Commissioner Sullivan requested an update on high cellular costs with the Verizon wireless phones and modem plans. DC Hochstein noted the Department is still working to resolve the issues.
 - > Commissioner Fischer requested an update on Sound Transit's new light pole at Station 65. DC Hochstein noted the Department is working to replace the temporary light pole with a permanent one, similar to others on the property.

- 2024 Budget Narrative:
 - > At its November 2, 2023 Board Meeting, the Board of Commissioners approved the 2024 budget. As part of the budget process, the 2024 Budget Narrative is attached for approval.
