Northshore Fire Department Strategic Planning Discussion 2024



Situation

- The fire property tax has been limited to about a 1% increase since 2005.
 - In 2013 the levy rate was at \$1.00, but now has dropped to the current rate of \$.50.
- This has forced the fire benefit charge (FBC) to take an ever increasing share of the revenue, and the result is we are now pushing up against the 60% cap.
 - Also note that the FBC ends next year and will need to potentially be reauthorized.
- This has been recognized for a long time with both Fire Commissioners and administrative staff asking for a levy lid lift over the past decade.
- If we don't do anything we will likely need to pull from reserves next year to meet financial obligations.

Options

- If we do not pursue a regionalization effort then:
 - Put a property tax levy rate increase ballot measure to voters in August of 2024.
 - Put a FBC re-authorization ballot measure to voters in April of 2025.
- We can pursue regionalization (merger or regional fire authority (RFA)) with Shoreline Fire Department (SFD).
 - This would allow for the adoption of SFD's FBC, which doesn't end until 2031.
 - Efficiencies of combining resources would remove the immediate pressure on the combined Department's new levy rate.
- If we were to pursue a regionalization effort then:
 - Put a merger or RFA ballot measure for voters in August of 2024.

History

- A full merger of NFD/SFD has been discussed for many decades.
- In 2014 the Fire Chiefs and Union Presidents met and agreed to put together a merger.
- However, before this could happen a RFA proposal including NFD, BFD, Sno10, and WFR was started. SFD was not included and it failed to get support after about 2 ½ years.
- In 2018 NFD and SFD again started talking merger, which gained traction and was going to be formally introduced. WFR requested to be included, which was approved.
- Instead, in 2019 a three-way merger was discussed, but then NFD/WFR started discussions on a two-way merger without SFD.
- In 2021 the merger of NFD/WFR was turned down by voters.
- In 2022 a contract for full services between NFD and SFD was approved.

PRO/CON

Status Quo, remain in Current Form

Advantages

- Keeps funding control at local level.
- Keeps governance at local level.

Disadvantages

- While more financially and logistically efficient than stand alone, still not as efficient as other options where money and time could be saved.
- Will need to run back to back ballot measures for continued funding (but this is a short-term impact).
- May need to consider changes next year anyway, depending on what happens in Bothell.
- Potential voter fatigue.

PRO/CON

Merger of NFD into SFD

Advantages

- Complete financial, operational, and logistical efficiency.
- Diversification of revenues and adoption of SFD FBC.
- Increased involvement of NFD Commissioners in governance of organization.
- Simple majority vote.

Disadvantages

- Depending on total financial package, could increase overall equivalent levy rate for LFP/Kenmore (but this would likely be a minor increase of about \$.02 levy rate or even none at all, depending on assumptions).
- LFP/Kenmore residents would not get to vote on the merger.
- NFD would no longer exist, but neither would SFD as we would consider a new name for the Department.
- Initially NFD Commissioners would populate the governance board, but through attrition we would reduce down to 5, or 7 with a vote.

PRO/CON

NFD and SFD Become a RFA

Advantages

- Complete financial, operational, and logistical efficiency.
- Diversification of revenues and adoption of SFD FBC.
- Complete involvement of NFD Commissioners in governance of organization and Commissioners could represent LFP/Kenmore specifically.
- Would allow for others to join into the RFA and FBC with a simple majority vote.
- All voters would vote.

Disadvantages

- More complicated than a merger.
- Would initially require a super majority vote.
- Depending on total financial package, could increase overall equivalent levy rate for LFP/Kenmore (but this would likely be a minor increase of about \$.02 levy rate or even none at all, depending on assumptions).
- NFD would no longer exist, but neither would SFD as we would consider a new name for the Department.
