<u>MINUTES</u> <u>March 14, 2024</u>

SPECIAL MEETING BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS at Northshore Fire Department's Headquarters Station 51 and Virtual Meeting via Zoom

I. OPEN SPECIAL NORTHSHORE MEETING

1.1 Roll Call

Chair Lisa Wollum called the meeting to order at 4:00 PM.

Persons in attendance were Commissioners Josh Pratt, Tyler Byers, Rick Webster, and Lisa Wollum. Also present was Chief Matt Cowan, Legal Counsel Matt Paxton, Board Secretary Amy Oakley, and 3 members of the public. Commissioner Eric Adman was absent.

II. PUBLIC COMMENT

2.1 The Board heard public comment from David Maehren.

III. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Commissioner Webster moved to adopt the agenda as presented. Commissioner Pratt seconded. The motion passed unanimously 4-0.

IV. BOARD DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS

- 4.1 Discussion and decision of option(s) to pursue for August 2024 special election
 - o Chief Cowan and the Board discussed financial estimates for a proposed RFA.
 - O Commissioner Wollum and Commissioner Adman stated they have a remote interest with the Shoreline Fire Department, as it relates to Commissioner Wollum's husband's employment at Shoreline Fire Department, and Commissioner Adman's employment with the Shoreline Fire Department. Neither Commissioner Wollum or Commissioner Adman can be the tie-breaking vote.

Commissioner Byers moved to proceed with the creation of an RFA Planning Committee in preparation of the August 2024 election. Commissioner Pratt seconded. The Board discussed. Commissioner Pratt moved to call to question the discussion. Commissioner Webster seconded. The motion to end the discussion pass unanimously 4-0. The Board then voted on the motion to create an RFA Planning Committee in preparation for the August 2024 election. Commissioners Wollum and Byer voted aye, Webster and Pratt voted nay. The motion did not pass.

o The Board discussed the option of pursuing a levy lid lift on the August 2024 ballot, and then a fire benefit charge increase or RFA measure for next year (2025).

- 4.2 If appropriate, appointment of members to RFA Planning Committee
 - o Commissioners Pratt, Webster, and Byers will be on the planning RFA Committee. Commissioners compensated will be \$70/day.
 - Chief Cowan will meet with the Shoreline Board to determine if they are in favor of joining an RFA Committee.

V. RESOLUTION

5.1 If appropriate, 2024-01 Appointment of members to RFA Planning Committee

Commissioner Pratt moved to pass Resolution 2024-01 as stated to Establish a Regional Fire Authority Planning Committee. Commissioner Webster seconded. The motion passed unanimously 4-0.

The next meeting on April 2, 2024 meeting will include the standard agenda items as well as update from the subcommittee on Station 54 and subcommittee on outbuildings at Station 51, RFA Planning Committee, levy lid lift ballot measure. NORTHSHORE BALLOT OPTIONS

Situation:

Since 2007, the revenue collected through property taxes has been limited to a 1% annual increase. In 2013 the levy rate was at \$1.00 per \$1,000 in AV, but now due to rising property values and the 1% limit on annual levy increases, the levy rate has dropped to the current rate of approximately \$.52 per \$1,000 of AV.

Over time, the FBC has been used to make up an increasing share of the revenue. As a result, the FBC now represents close to 60%. The FBC cannot exceed 60% of budget.

The current FBC expires in 2024 (to be collected in 2025) and will need to be reauthorized by the voters.

Option 1: Do nothing.

• If we don't do anything, we will likely need to pull from reserves next year, or cut costs, to meet financial obligations.

Option 2: Property Tax Levy Rate Increase (Levy Lid Lift) on August 2024 ballot AND reauthorize FBC in 2025.

- Remain in current form and put a property tax levy rate increase measure on August of 2024 ballot. If passed, the ballot measure would increase the 2024 levy (for collection in 2025). This ballot measure requires a simple majority to pass, and does not require "validation" (i.e. a minimum number of "yes" votes based on the number of people who voted in the previous general election within the district).
- **Budget Implications:** Raising the levy lid lift will reduce the FBC percentage of the budget.
- **Timeline:** Before May 3, 2024, the Board will need to pass levy lid lift resolution. Legal Counsel, Matt Paxon, can draft resolution, including the ballot measure and explanatory statement. If passed by the Board, a cover letter is drafted and sent to King County Elections Office.
- Put Fire Benefit Charge reauthorization measure on any ballot in 2025 (Feb, April, August, or November). This ballot measure requires a simple majority to pass, and does not require validation

Option 3: Northshore merges into Shoreline.

 This would allow for the adoption of Shoreline Fire Department's FBC, which does not expire until 2031, and its levy rate. A merger requires a majority vote from Northshore voters. • **Timeline:** A merger requires a merger petition and approval, a SEPA review, and Boundary Review Board approval. Not reasonable timeframe to accomplish the checklist before May 3rd, 2024, in order to be on the August 2024 ballot.

Option 4: Establish Regional Fire Authority (RFA) with Shoreline Fire Dept.

- Formation of RFA allows a single, separate entity to provide service within the jurisdictions of the participating fire districts.
- Requires simple majority of the entire proposed RFA area, unless the RFA Plan including funding from a revenue source that requires a super majority (60%), such as a FBC, EMS levy, or excess levy.
- Would allow for others to join into the RFA with a simple majority vote.
- The District may need to proceed with a levy lid lift if the RFA is not formed by November 30, 2024, after which date the RFA would not be able to levy taxes in 2024 (to be collected in 2025). The District would need to proceed with reauthorization of its FBC if the RFA is not formed by November 30, 2025, after which date the RFA would not be able to assess a FBC in 2025 (to be collected in 2026).
- Budget Implications: TBD

• Timeline:

- o Each Fire District appoints 3 elected officials, by resolution, to Planning Committee.
- Planning Committee negotiates RFA Name, Governance (including bylaws), Finances (including FBC), and Property (how assets are divvied up or pooled including, real property, reserve accounts, and apparatus). Must allow and encourage public input in the RFA Plan development.
- Plan gets approved by Planning Committee. The Plan must include, at a minimum, discussion of revenue sources and funding, form of governance, organizational structure/employment/operations, and asset transfers / capital facilities planning.
- Each Board approves the RFA Plan and calls a special election. Legal Counsel drafts language for resolution for Boards approval and packet to go to the King County elections committee.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS OF KING COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT NO. 16 ESTABLISHING A REGIONAL FIRE AUTHORITY PLANNING COMMITTEE
WHEREAS , RCW 52.26.020 provides that two or more fire protection jurisdictions within reasonable proximity may create a regional fire authority ("RFA:) and convene a RFA planning committee (the "Planning Committee"); and
WHEREAS , King County Fire Protection District No. 16 d/b/a Northshore Fire Department ("NFD") and King County Fire Protection District No. 4 d/b/a Shoreline Fire Department ("SFD") are adjacent fire protection jurisdictions;
WHEREAS , NFD believes it is in the best interests of its citizens to explore the creation of an RFA pursuant to RCW 52.26 with SFD;
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Fire Commissioners of NFD, as follows:
1. Planning Committee . NFD shall participate in the Planning Committee for the formation of an RFA with SFD.
2. Appointment of Commissioners . NFD hereby appoints the following three (3) elected commissioners to the Planning Committee pursuant to RCW 52.26.030(2):
3. Compensation and Reimbursement . Members of the Planning Committee shall receive compensation of seventy dollars per day, or portion thereof, not to exceed seven hundred dollars (\$70) per day, for attendance at Planning Committee meetings and for performance of other services on behalf of the RFA. Members of the Planning Committee shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel and incidental expenses according to NSF policy. PASSED AND ADOPTED by the Commission of Northshore Fire Department in open session on the 14 th day of March 2024, and duly authenticated by the signatures of the Commissioners voting in favor thereof.
