MINUTES

May 21, 2019

REGULAR MEETING BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

at Northshore Fire Department's Headquarters Station 51

I. OPENING OF MEETING

1.1 <u>Roll Call</u>

Chair Suzanne Greathouse called the meeting to order at 5:00 PM.

The meeting was held for three minutes to address recording equipment change-over.

Persons in attendance were Commissioners Rick Verlinda, Ron Gehrke, Don Ellis, Suzanne Greathouse, and Dave Maehren. Also present was Legal Counsel Scott Missall, Legal Counsel Emily Miner, Board Secretary Kate Hansen, Deputy Chief Eric Magnuson, Firefighter Gunnar Seefeld, Lieutenant Anders Hansson, Firefighter Tim Tyler, Battalion Chief Doug Knight, Firefighter Todd McInturff, and fourteen members of the public.

1.2 Adoption of Meeting Minutes of May 14th

Commissioner Ellis moved to approve the Minutes of May 14th. Commissioner Gehrke seconded. The motion passed all in favor.

Commissioner Maehren moved to approve the agenda as amended. Commissioner Verlinda seconded. The motion passed all in favor.

IV. BOARD DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS

4.1 Department Leadership Transition and Next Steps

Commissioner Greathouse reported that legal counsel is preparing a memo outlining recommendations related to next steps including regionalization and other current issues. The memo will be presented at the June 4th meeting. Legal Counsel recommended that Deputy Chief

Magnuson continue as Acting Chief until further discussion and consideration by the board has occurred. The board discussed.

Commissioner Ellis moved to appoint Deputy Chief Magnuson as Acting Fire Chief. Commissioner Gehrke seconded. The board discussed. The motion passed unanimously.

4.2 <u>Employee Recognition</u>

Commissioner Verlinda presented options for Employee Retirement Recognition by the Board of Commissioners and ideas for formalizing the board's involvement in retirement recognition. The board discussed.

The board agreed to move forward with reviewing potential changes and improvements to Employee Retirement Recognition practices. The board will review Commissioner Verlinda's proposed policies. Commissioner Verlinda and Acting Chief Magnuson will discuss the solicitation of input from district employees. The topic will be further discussed at the end of July.

4.3 Access to Legal Services

Commissioner Greathouse reported that legal counsel is drafting a memo for the June 4th meeting that will outline recommended Board practices for accessing legal services. Presently, board members should only access legal counsel through Acting Chief Magnuson for district business. The board shall access legal counsel through the Chair for Board business The board discussed.

4.4 Commissioner Meet and Greet

Commissioner Greathouse stated that legal counsel recommends any meetings with other legislative bodies be postponed until the board has addressed current issues requiring board focus, and that when such a gathering does occur, it be as a Public Meeting. The board discussed.

Commissioner Maehren moved to accept the invitation from Shoreline and that the Chief and Board Chair be directed to find a mutually agreeable date and location for an open public meeting to discuss items of mutual interest. Commissioner Ellis seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Maehren moved to accept the invitation from Woodinville and that the Chief and Board Chair be directed to find a mutually agreeable date and location for an open public meeting to discuss items of mutual interest. Commissioner Verlinda seconded. The board discussed. The motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Maehren moved to cancel the July 3rd meeting. Commissioner Verlinda seconded. The board discussed. The motion passed unanimously.
