



# Is saving a life on your **FALL CHECKLIST?**

You have the power to save lives! Blood donors provide the gift of life to Pacific Northwest hospitals so that medical teams can treat patients with cancer, those receiving organ transplants, and for those who have been burned or experienced other traumas. Donors are needed from our communities in December.

Donating blood is a critical and safe activity. Appointments, face masks, and photo ID are still required. No walk-ins, guests, or people under age 16 are permitted onsite. Please allow 40-60 minutes to complete the entire donation process. If you have been told in the past that you can't donate blood, please try again, as donation criteria is updated often by the FDA.
