Scheduling Visits

The Safety Center is open by appointment only.

All visits must be pre-arranged with our Community Education Officer.

Safety Center Hours:

Monday - Thursday 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM

Please note that some dates and times may not be available due to other scheduling obligations. We suggest having alternative dates if your first choice is unavailable when making your appointment.

Before calling to schedule a visit, please make sure your group meets the following criteria:

- ◆ Group must qualify as a Shoreline, Kenmore, Lake Forest Park or Woodway day care, preschool, or play group
- ◆ Fee assessed for out of District groups
- ◆ Group size is limited to 15 children
- ◆ At least 3 adult chaperones must be present with the group at all times
- ◆ Safety Center visits last for about 1 hour
- ◆ No food or drink is allowed in the Safety Center

Please make carpool arrangements.

Parking space is limited.
