Facilities:

Access to outlets is limited and unavailable if not already specifically requested, so please plan accordingly.

Handshake:

This is where we refer our student to begin their job search. If you are unfamiliar with the app or run into problems while using it, please go to the front desk at the entrance of the main dining hall.

International Students:

Students studying here on visas often have questions about their eligibility to work with different employers. If they have visa-related questions that you are unsure of, we have staff they can ask at the International Education booth.

They may mention **OPT** (Optional Practice Training) or CPT (Curricular Practical Training) - this is a feature of their visa that allows them to stay up to a year after graduation if they find employment that is within their field of study.

LinkedIn:

We encourage our students to use LinkedIn often. Some students may ask to connect with you or your business when they meet with you.

Job Applicants:

Our students have been urged to bring their resumes and dress professionally. Expect them to ask about what open positions you have and what you are looking for in an applicant – they may refer to tips we have provided them.

To help job seekers focus conversations with employers offering the types or roles they are looking for, we have created these categories. We expect many employers to have roles that overlap with multiple programs of study, so we have left that category off.
